The 57TH ZLÍN FILM FESTIVAL IS KICKING OFF

Zlín - For a whole nine days Zlín will be taken over by the 57th International Film Festival for Children and Youth. The Zlín Film Festival begins on Friday, May 26, and will last until Saturday, June 3. In addition to the film competition and the showcase of Swedish and Swiss films, there will be a plethora of supporting programs organized for all generations and there will be many film stars from both the Czech Republic and abroad.

The program of the 57th Zlín Film Festival promises event-filled days. Compared to last year's festival, this one is a day longer and offers new a location for both film screenings and the supporting program. "We want to bring new enticements and experiences to our festival's audiences and visitors. We greatly value their approval; last year we had a total of 125,000 visitors. We believe that we will again manage to satisfy and surprise them, "said Zlín Film Festival's president Čestmír Vančura." The program is not single-focused; we've thought not only about children and young people, but also about our adult visitors. In addition to the films, sport, active recreation, gastronomy, science and entertainment also have a place here."

Among the new locations is the Relax Gastro Zone in the chateau park, which includes a presentation of both healthy and local food in addition to fun for the youngest kids at the Playful Forecourt. More space will be given to the Kudlov film studios, which, aside from a number of film exhibitions, will serve as an additional location for film screenings. For example, here you'll be able to find films made by graduates of the Zlín Film School.

The film program contains a total of 326 films, including 152 competitive ones. "*Competing for the awards are 26 feature-length films, 60 short animated movies, and 66 short student films,*" says the festival's artistic director Markéta Pášmová.

The main theme of the festival will be Swedish cinema with an emphasis on the work of Astrid Lindgren; it will be 110 years since her birth this year. The famous Swedish writer and the popular heroin of her Pippi Longstocking books will also be found in the festival's visual style, which has been designed by the artist Petr Nikl. "*The showcase of Swedish works for children and youth includes 37 feature-length movies,*" says Markéta Pášmová, adding: "*We've also focused on Switzerland, and in this section we will screen 16 feature films and a wide range of student and animated films. A documentary by the Swiss director Robert Kolinsky will have its premiere here - To Make a Comedy Is No Fun: Jiří Menzel."*

There will be a total of 199 films making their premieres here, including 18 world premieres, such as a documentary about Hermína Týrlová, the film *Together Then* by Marta Gerliková from Wallachia, and *The Dukat Rock*, which was filmed at Lukov Castle, among other places, with Martin Dejdar, Filip Blažek , Kateřina Brožová, Martin Zounar and Andrej Hryc.

Many interesting and valued guests are coming to Zlín, including Theodor Pištěk, Magdalena Kožená, Jiří Menzel, Dagmar Havlová, Karel Smyczek, Miroslav Donutil, Martin Dejdar, Aňa Geislerová, Lenka Krobotová, Eliška Balzerová, Roman Zach, Jan Onder, Karel Janák and more. There will also be 91 delegations accompanying both competitive and non-competitive movies.



The international juries will be composed of renowned film professionals from the Czech Republic and abroad, chaired by the Swedish screenwriter and director Catti Edfeldt. The Czech and Slovak Republics are represented, for example, by actresses Klára Issová, Vica Kerekes, Petra Nesvačilová, and Karel Zeman's daughter Ludmila Zemanová, plus the local Zlín native and director Slávek Horák, and Slovak director Juraj Nvota. "Our children's juries are also international, and like each year they are made up of 13 representatives; this year they are from Norway, Canada, Spain, Slovakia, Slovenia, Poland and the Czech Republic," added Markéta Pášmová.

Another non-competition part of the program will again be the section Young Stars, in which we regularly introduce young and hopeful actors with whom the audience can meet in person while in Zlín. This year, four rising film actors from Germany, Great Britain, Denmark, and from distant Canada are coming to the festival. "Brit Daniel Huttlestone has had an interesting acting and singing experience in his 17 years. He's had roles in the movie musicals Les Misérables and Into the Woods alongside such stars as Hugh Jackman and Meryl Streep," says Markéta Pášmová, adding: "Canadian Devery Jacobs comes from a tribe of indigenous people, the Mohawk, and together with the director she's coming to introduce the movie The Sun at Midnight, which was filmed at the Polar Circle."

A lot of attention will also be focused on this year's Clapperboard Salon, which is celebrating its 20th anniversary. This project has seen 2222 artistically rendered film clapperboards over its duration. The proceeds of their auction are always devoted to supporting the film projects of film school students. Over the previous 19 years, 330 projects were supported for a total amount exceeding 28 million Czech crowns (nearly 1,500,000 Euros).

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DATES AND VENUES

Zlín Film Festival 2017 – the 57th International Film Festival for Children and Youth will take place from Friday, May 26 till Saturday, June 3, in Zlín and other partner towns.

The supporting programme of the 57th Zlín Film Festival was launched in February with the opening of the exhibition of the **20th Film Clapperboards Salon** in the building of the Czech Senate. Artistic clapperboards were then displayed in Mladá Boleslav, Brno, Olomouc and Ostrava.

Apart from supporting events and supporting events in partner towns, 11 towns around the country will be visited by the festival **Cinema Train**. For the first time, this "cinema on wheels has visited the Austrian town of Retz, taking the festival outside the Czech Republic.

For the first time, the inhabitants of the town of **Mikulov** will be able to enjoy the atmosphere of the festival. The **Echoes of the Zlín Festival** will introduce 18 unique films for children and young people to the local filmgoers. The supporting programme will include workshops, theatrical performances and exhibitions.

ZLÍN LOCATIONS

The number of festival venues has been increased in Zlín as well. This year's hot news in the **Relax Gastro Zone** at the Sad Svobody park next to the Zlín castle, offering healthy food, regional specialities and interesting lectures, and the **Castle Playground Zone**, featuring organized and free entertainment, information and relaxation.

In the Náměstí Míru square, you can visit the **Hamlet of Creative Workrooms** with art workshops, contests, quizzes and other entertainment for children, and the **Festival Café**, offering talk shows with festival guests.

In the Komenského park, you will find the **Arbour - Safety Centre**, a project focused on a playful education in safety prevention, prepared jointly by the Zlín Film Festival and the students of the Faculty of Humanities of Tomas Bata University in Zlín. Yet another novelty is the circus big top with the **Film Piano** with screenings of Charlie Chaplin slapstick comedies accompanied by live piano music.

We will also continue last year's hugely successful Dancing in the Street and the **Festival Narrow Street**, connecting the castle park with the Náměstí Míru square.

INTERESTING PREMIERES

HERMÍNA TÝRLOVÁ

(CZE, 2017, 60 mins.) Directed by Pavel Jirásek Friday, May 26 at 20.00

The story of the first lady of animated film, who dedicated her whole life to films for children. The film presents the internal development of the animation poetics of Hermína Týrlová, highlighting the aesthetic and technological problems resulting from a number of experiments, many of which she introduced in the world context. She invented plots, wrote screenplays and often even made props for her films. She worked with a wide range of materials - from wood to plastic, wool, stone, modurite, fabrics and regional pastries. The central line of narration is her specific way of animation, which is close to the world of children, supported by scenes reconstructing the process of animation of works which were awarded prizes at the most prestigious international festivals...

JIŘÍ MENZEL – TO MAKE COMEDY IS NO FUN

(Switzerland, 2016, 80 mins.) Directed by Robert Kolinsky Saturday, May 27 at 17.30

The story of an exceptional filmmaker. In 1968, the Oscar for Best Foreign Language Film went to *Closely Watched Trains*, the first feature-length work of Czechoslovakian director Jiří Menzel. Just a year later, Menzel's next film, *Larks on a String*, was banned by the totalitarian regime. Menzel, however, decided to stay in his socialist country and continue working as a theatre and film director and actor. His comedies and films of even more serious genres were commercially successful because the director tested the boundaries of the authorities at that time with elaborately hidden political messages. Today, among Menzel's admirers and friends are personalities like Miloš Forman, Ken Loach, Emir Kusturica, and István Szabó.

The film will be personally introduced in Zlín by director Robert Kolinsky and director Jiří Menzel.

THAT TIME TOGETHER

(CZE, 2017, 75 mins.) Directed by Marta Santovjáková Gerlíková and Jiří Novotný Saturday, May 27 at 19.20 Friday, June 2, at 10.40

After last year's world premiere of the Wallachian film The Grandfather, the Zlín Film Festival presents another film story from the Wallachian hills. Its title is That Time Together and it will be premiered on the big screen on Saturday, May 27 at 19.20. The 15-year-old Barbora Černotová took the lead, supported by František Segrado, who already appeared in The Grandfather. Eliška Balzerová appears as the film narrator.

The film tells the story of a young Jewish girl Tereza Zágorová, who finds shelter in the Wallachian hills from deportation which has struck her family. Terezka tries to fit into the new environment and learns how different life in the village is from that in the town. However, also the countryside suffers the weight of the war and the girl must be careful not to reveal her secrets.



FROM PARIS TO PARIS

(France, 2016, 110 mins.) Directed by Christian Duguay Sunday, May 28 at 17.10 Monday, May 29 at 10.30

In this film we follow the fate of two young Jewish boys living in France during the Second World War. When Joseph Joff was ten, he and his brother Maurice received some money and a map from their father. His father thus sent them on a dangerous journey in the hope that they would escape from Nazi-occupied Paris in 1941. On their way to the demilitarized zone in the south, however, both boys are inevitably trapped in the maelstrom of war. With the occasional help from kind people, the siblings attempt to break through the obstacles that the Nazis have set up. They want to avoid the terrible fate of many others who have tried the same.

THE DUCAT ROCK

(CZE, 2017, 106 mins.) Directed by Ján Novák Sunday, May 28 at 10.00

The main heroes of the film with fairy-tale motives are members of a group of children who experience a holiday adventure in the small village of Lukov. In order be able to help their friends in need, they set out on a search for a treasure hidden in a castle and for a legend associated with it. In their search for the treasure they are trapped by the Black Lady, the guardian of treasure. However, the whole village and the children's parents unite their forces and in the end not only find the treasure, but ultimately also break the curse and free the castle and its guardian.

The world premiere of the fairy-tale, which was partly shot at the nearby Lukov castle, will take place in Zlín. Leading actors include Martin Dejdar, Filip Blažek, Kateřina Brožová, Martin Zounar or Andrej Hryc.
