THE ZLÍN FILM FESTIVAL UNVEILS THE WINNING FILMS OF ITS 62ND YEAR

Zlín – On the seventh day, June 1, the program of this year's Zlín Film Festival came to an end. This year, 122 films were included in the festival's competitions, which were viewed and evaluated by expert juries. The Indian film Gandhi & Co., the Tunisian film A Second Life, the Franco-Swiss-Ukrainian film Olga, and the Czech animated film Suzie in the Garden were selected as the best of them.

The 62nd Zlín Film Festival, which took place from 26 May to 1 June 2022, was concluded with a gala evening. The announcement of the winning films could also be watched live on television on channel ČT Art.

"We are very pleased that we were able to experience this year's festival to the fullest and together. After two years spent mostly online, we welcomed audiences in large numbers to cinema halls and zones with a supporting program. And according to their enthusiasm it is evident that they, too, were really looking forward to the festival. This was also evidenced by the cinema attendance figures. Interest in film screenings was constant, both in the morning at screenings for schools and in the afternoon, when families with children came," says Čestmír Vančura, president of the Zlín Film Festival.

Golden Slippers were won the Indian film **Gandhi & Co.** as the best feature film for children, Tunisian **A Second Life** as the best feature film for adolescents, **Olga** as the best feature film for youth, and the Czech animated film **Suzie in the Garden**.

"We were pleasantly surprised by the interest of judges and audiences in films from exotic countries such as India, Chile, and Tunisia. It is also no surprise that the Franco-Swiss-Ukrainian film Olga, which touches on the current geopolitical situation, has won several awards. Its qualities were appreciated by an expert jury, and the audience's interest was reflected in its evaluation. In addition to the aforementioned Golden Slipper and the Youth Jury Prize, the film also won the Patron of the Children Audience Award, which is a new award at this year's festival," says Markéta Pášmová, artistic director of the Zlín Film Festival. The French film **Dragon Princess** succeeded in taking both the Karel Zeman Award and the children's jury award.



Two Czech actors were awarded the Golden Slipper for their contribution to cinema for children and youth. Actor, entertainer and moderator Pavel Zedníček took one during the opening evening of the festival from the president of the Zlín Film Festival Čestmír Vančura. Actor Karel Heřmánek won the award at the final gala evening. *"I like Zlín mainly thanks to the successful hosting of our Theater Without Handrails. It is a beautiful cultural city with a deep tradition. After the award I received here, I will love it even more,"* said Karel Heřmánek.

Actress Jitka Čvančarová sat at the head of the jury which evaluated the feature film competition for children. Actors Barbora Seidlová and Jan Šťastný unveiled their two stars on the Walk of Fame in front of the Grand Cinema this year. In addition to them, other personalities from the world of film also came to Zlín, and many of them introduced their films here. Delegations accompanied films such as Journey to *Yourland, The Path, My Robot Brother, Bigman,* and *The Cursed Cave.* This year's Young Stars were Jan Nedbal, who came with the film *The Report* and Brigita Cmuntová with the film *The Sign Painter.* A total of eight films had their world premiere or distribution premiere at the festival.

This year, the festival met with great interest from audiences, including film professionals, accredited guests, and the public. A total of 2,264 people were accredited. "Attendance at the cinemas for the film screenings was 22,500 moviegoers, which means almost 90% of the cinemas are occupied. According to our estimates, more than 100,000 visitors took part in the supporting program during the festival. We also organized 87 workshops, which were attended by 1,688 children," said the executive director of the Zlín Film Festival Jarmila Záhorová. "We have newly included the Liberty Chateau zone among the festival locations with a program prepared especially for teenagers. It included virtual reality, e-sports, parkour, film screenings, discussions, and more. According to the responses, we think that we have met the teenagers' tastes."

The festival also saw increased interest in visiting the cinema from schools. It welcomed a total of 408 school groups from 58 schools, from both Zlín and outside Zlin. For example, children came from Přerov and Litomyšl.

The auction at the 25th Clapperboard Salon achieved a record result. The collection was made up of artistically rendered clapperboards contributed by 123 artists. All the clapperboards at the auction (part of the festival's supporting program) found owners and yielded a total of CZK 3,572,000. From the proceeds, the FILMTALENT Zlín Endowment Fund supported 30 projects of young filmmakers, among which it will distribute CZK 2.2 million.

This year's Zlín Film Festival is coming to an end, but it will not reach its full conclusion until the end of June. First, selected film screenings will be presented from June 9 to 12 as part of the Mikulov Echoes, and then a special series of animated films for the youngest



children will be screened from June 25 to 26 in cooperation with the Spejbl and Hurvínek Theatre under the title Animáky u Spejblů. The 63rd Zlín Film Festival is being planned by the organizers for the period of June 1 to 7, 2023.



THE 25TH CLAPPERBOARD SALON AUCTIONED A RECORD CZK 3,572,000 AT THE ZLÍN FILM FESTIVAL

On Sunday, May 29, the Zlín Film Festival held its a traditional auction of artistically rendered clapperboards. The works were contributed by 123 artists to the 25th year of the Salon and all the created clapperboards already have happy owners. Jaroslav Němeček's clapperboard "*Dracula and Four-leaf Clover*" was auctioned for the highest amount. In total, the auction yielded CZK 3,572,000, an amount that exceeded last year's maximum by several hundred thousand. The funds from the proceeds will be used by the FILMTALENT ZLÍN Endowment Fund to support projects of young promising filmmakers.

The large hall of the Zlín Congress Centre was filled on Sunday, May 29 at 1 p.m. with those interested in bidding on the clapperboards from this year's collection of the Clapperboard Salon. It has been part of the supporting program of the Zlín Film Festival for twenty-five years and Jaroslav Němeček, Kristian Kodet, Kateřina Miler, Iva Hüttnerová, and others have contributed to it.

The greatest interest was again a clapperboard by Jaroslav Němeček, "*Dracula and Four-leaf Clover*", for which its new owner paid 111 thousand crowns. Coincidentally, this is the same amount for which this author's clapperboard was auctioned off last year. Other successful clapperboards were "*Libuška*" by Michal Janovský for CZK 110 thousand and "*The Devil Floriman and Blackbird Franta*" by Pavel Čech for CZK 77 thousand.

"In this year's auction, thanks to the enormous interest of the bidders, we again won a record amount of CZK 3,572,000," confirmed Čestmír Vančura, president of the Zlín Film Festival. The proceeds of the auction support film projects of film school students and other young filmmakers. Financial support is provided by the FILMTALENT Zlín Foundation for original live-acted films, animation, and those hovering on the edge of the documentary genre.

In this year, a total of 75 projects applied for support, thirty of them succeeded with their application and received the required amount from the FILMTALENT ZLÍN Endowment Fund. A total of CZK 2.2 million will be distributed among them. The projects were judged by an expert jury consisting of Václav Marhoul, Zuzana Mistríková, Petr Vlček and Čestmír Vančura.

"The proof that the money is spent meaningfully is in the success of the supported films not only in the Czech Republic, but also abroad," stated Markéta Pášmová, artistic director of the Zlín Film Festival. "The most recent is The Czech Lion for Best Short Film and the Magnesia Award for Best Student Film - both of these awards went to Diana Cam Van Nguyen's Dear Dad." The number of supported projects, including this year's, has reached 411.

During the entire history of the Clapperboard Salon, 2,872 artistically rendered clapperboards have been auctioned off and have brought in a total of CZK 44,561,000. The most successful for the entire period of the project's existence is still Libor Vojkůvka's clapperboard "*Desires Full, Clapperboard Open*", which a bidder bought in 2008 for 199 thousand crowns. The complete collection can be seen on the salonfilmovychklapek.cz website, which contains an overview of all the clapperboards from all 25 Salons, plus adds information about individual authors and other interesting tidbits.

ABOUT THE ZLÍN FILM FESTIVAL

The International Film Festival for Children and Youth is the oldest and, currently, largest film festival of its kind in the world. Its prestige increases every year not only in the Czech Republic, but also abroad. This is evidenced by the number of invitations and the participation of ZFF representatives to sit in the juries of international festivals in Russia, Latvia, Germany, Poland, Greece, India, and other countries of the world, plus the enormous amount of interest in the festival's film dramaturgy.

The festival received an important award at the end of 2019 in Tokyo, Japan at the KINEKO International Children's Film Festival, where it won the KINEKO HONORARY AWARD for its contribution to cinematography for children and youth.

The festival's mission is to present international film productions for children and teenagers, to make them accessible to the child audiences, and offer a high-quality alternative to commonly available audiovisual content. An important aspect of the festival is to educate young audiences through the medium of film, expand their awareness of the outside world, and develop their aesthetic, social, and moral feelings. The aim of the program is to systematically contribute to the development of Czech cinema for children and youth. The organizer of the festival is the company FILMFEST, s.r.o..
